Bethlehem Community Garden Guidelines

- 1. We are an Organic Garden. This means we use organic fertilizers and non chemical means of controlling pests and weeds. We ask that all gardeners follow this approach in their gardening.
- 2. Each gardener is responsible for the maintenance and upkeep of their garden plot. Please water, weed, harvest your plot as needed and with an awareness that your neighbor is affected by what you do or don't do.
- 3. Please remove any trash from your plot meaning, bags, garden pots, etc. and discard at home.
- 4. All weeds and plant matter need to be placed in the compost pile at the east end of the garden. Please do not leave bins or wagons full of weeds in your plot.
- 5. Tools of all types are available for shared use. The community garden tools are marked with green tape and are in
 - 1.the large shed in the parking lot,
 - 2.tool shed at the entrance to the garden
 - 3.in plastic covered bins near the raised beds. Please return the tools to the appropriate containers.

And let us know if tools are broken.

- 6. Water....always a challenge. Ask to be shown how to turn the "master" hose on at the NW corner of the garden. And be sure the water is off when you are the last person to leave the garden.
- 7. Gates, Again the last person in the garden needs to be sure both gates are closed when departing.
- 8. Children need to be supervised in the garden...but they also need to be rewarded with raspberries, blueberries and peaches while at the garden!
- 9. Dogs are not allowed in the fence area of the garden.
- 10. Care of your plot at the end of the season is essential for good preparedness for next Spring planting. You are responsible to remove weeds, vegetable plants and discard in the compost pile.
- 11. WE NEED HELP! Our community garden provides produce to the Foodbank in town. We have provided between 1000-1500 pounds each year to those in need in town. We ask that each plot renter come to scheduled work days and/or weed and wine evenings and/or, help harvest, and/or take on a work in the "community plot" at one's own time to help.
